
We're looking for lots of keen volunteers to get involved in the Hidden Treasures project. You can decide how little or how much you do.

LOVERS' MARKS are unique pieces of graffiti carved into the roof lead. They were left by 19thcentury plumbers, and later by visiting couples who climbed the tower

THE ROLL OF **HONOUR**

commemorates Bilborough men who served in World War I. Those whose names are in gold died for their country, and are buried abroad near where



THE HARDBOARD **CRUCIFIX** is a mystery. It has the name Frances Caryll Houselander on the back in pencil and bears a quote from the French writer Victor Hugo.





THE 1970s CHURCH was built in 1972. The congregation had grown rapidly after World War II, and this extension provided much-needed space and warmth.



THE ANNUNCIATION MURAL shows the Angel Gabriel telling Mary that she will give birth to Jesus, the Son of God. In the background you can see local landmarks, including St Martin's Church.

THE EAST **WINDOW**

was bricked up in 1972, but has recently been restored. It floods the church with light every morning, symbolising new life with God.





THE TOWER is about 40 feet high and was refaced with Derbyshire gritstone in around 1450. It houses a single bell fitted in 1888 and weighing 224 kilograms.



CHURCHYARD

retains its village atmosphere, despite the nearby housing estates. It's a haven for wildlife, too. Burials here go back to the Middle Ages, but the oldest identifiable gravestone dates from 1736.

THE SOUTH PORCH is decorated with carved heads of a king and queen, as well as delicate floral motifs. It was built slightly later than the rest of the church.



THE NAVE has Victorian oak pews and an oak pulpit. Analysis of the soil below the nave floor suggests there were many burials here, but the grave slabs were removed in the 19th century.



THE HELWYS **MEMORIAL**

commemorates Sir Edmund Helwys and his daughter. Sir Edmund's son, Thomas Helwys, worshipped at St Martin's, and later founded England's first Baptist Church in London in 1612.



THE CHANCEL **CEILING** dates from 1887 - '89. It's off-centre. but this is part of the church's character and charm. Every one of the floral oak ceiling bosses was skilfully carved by hand.

THE TOWER **WINDOW** dates from 1833. The window frame was deliberately built wider on the right, allowing golden light to flood into the church on bright evenings.
